The conference theme, "living a meaningful life is a risky business" aimed to challenge the narrative around risk and empowerment of residents/clients and staff.

Our fabulously talented Eden trainers were easily identifiable as room hosts. For some, they were also presenters sharing their story or that of others. It was wonderful to celebrate all the good that we are doing as an antidote to the negative stories we hear from the Aged Care Royal Commission in Australia. As Dr Bill Thomas noted, the work we are doing and have done to date is great, but we must remain dissatisfied with our achievements and continue to challenge the norm. If we become desensitised to the current status, we won't improve or grow.

There is much work to do. We are all charged with fighting ageism and improving the lives of Elders...one person at a time. There is MAGIC to make!
